MAINE CELTICS NOTES

HERE WE GO!: The Maine Celtics open the 2025-26 season tonight at Long Island. This is the 16th season of NBA G League basketball in Maine, and the fifth as the Maine Celtics. Maine and Greensboro met four times last season, with the Celtics winning 3 out of 4 matchups, including both games on the road. ***Maine has not lost a game in Greensboro since Feb. 25, 2023***, winning four straight contests at Novant Health Fieldhouse.

FROM ME TO NC: There are several connections between the Maine Celtics and the Charlotte Hornets/Greensboro Swarm. Former head coach **Blaine Mueller** (2023-24) led Maine to the NBA G League Finals and is currently an assistant coach with the Hornets. Two-Way Player **Drew Peterson** played 63 games over the last two seasons with Maine on a Two-Way deal and was part of Boston's NBA Championship in 2023-24. **DJ Rodman** played 25 games for Maine last season, and **Brandon Slater** was a standout for the Celtics in 2023-24, playing in 46 games.

PRESSEY MAKES DEBUT: Maine Celtics new head coach **Phil Pressey** will make his head coaching debut tonight at Greensboro. Pressey, who served as a player development coach in Boston last season, was named 11th head coach in Maine franchise history this fall, replacing **Tyler Lashbrook**, who left to accept a full-time assistant coach position with the Boston Celtics. ***Pressey is the first Maine head coach who also played for the franchise*** – the former point guard played one game for the then-Maine Red Claws during the 2014-15 season, scoring 34 points. Former Maine head coach **Jarell Christian** remains general manager of Maine for a fourth season.

NEW TWO-WAYS: The Maine Celtics have three new Two-Way players. **Max Shulga** and **Amari Williams** are both rookies, both selected by Boston in the Second Round of the 2025 NBA Draft. After a successful career at Kentucky, Williams was taken 46th overall, while Shulga, a VCU product, was selected at no. 57. **Ron Harper, Jr.** is currently on the third Two-Way slot.

NEW-LOOK CELTICS: Only three players are back with the Maine Celtics from last year's squad. Two-Way guard **Ron Harper, Jr.** is back with Maine after playing 14 games for the Celtics last season, averaging 17.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 2.7 assists per game. Harper earned a GATORADE Call-Up, signing a Two-Way Contract with the Detroit Pistons. Forward **Hason Ward** returns for a second season – in his rookie campaign, Ward was the only player to play in all 50 games in 2024-25. And **Kameron Warrens** returns to the Celtics for 2025-26 – the guard played 21 games for Maine last season.

NBA EXPERIENCE: The Maine Celtics boast 123 career NBA games played. **Ron Harper, Jr.** and **Amari Williams** have each played 2 games for Boston this season, while Harper also played for Detroit last season. **Jalen Bridges, Kendall Brown** and **Wendell Moore, Jr.** each share the NBA experience.

PLAYOFF PROWESS: Maine enters 2025-26 with back-to-back appearances in the Eastern Conference Finals of the NBA G League Playoffs. The Celtics lost to Osceola in the ECF last season, and Maine reached the NBA G League Finals for the first time ever in 2024-25, falling to Oklahoma City in three games.

SPLIT SEASON: Like last season, the first part of the NBA G League season will build towards the Tip-Off Tournament. The first 14 games of the season will build towards a winner-take-all tournament, which takes place at the NBA G League Winter Showcase in December. New for 2025-26, the standings will reset at the Showcase for a 36-game Regular Season, followed by traditional NBA G League Playoffs.

FIRST NBA POINTS: Two-Way big man **Amari Williams** got in the score sheet for the first time in Boston's loss to Houston on Nov. 1. The rookie got late minutes and scored his first NBA bucket, a floater in the paint. Williams is expected to be in Maine's lineup tonight in Greensboro.

REPLACING THE MVP: For the first time since the 2021-22 season, the Maine Celtics will be without **JD Davison**. The point guard played three seasons for Maine, all on a Two-Way Contract. Davison was named NBA G League MVP last season, averaging 25.6 points, 5.0 rebounds, and 7.8 assists per game. Davison finished his time in Maine as the franchise leader in almost every statistical category, including points (2,677), assists (1,065), steals (159), field goals (994), minutes (4,475),

and games played (133). He is also the franchise playoff leader in most categories. Davison finished last season on a full contract with Boston. He was waived in the off-season and is currently on a Two-Way Contract with the Houston Rockets.

Head Coach - Phil Pressey

On July 2, 2025, **Phil Pressey** made history, accepting the role of Head Coach for the 2025-26 NBA G League season. Pressey becomes the first head coach in franchise history to also play for Maine during his career. The former NBA guard played at the Portland Expo while on assignment from the Boston Celtics during the 2014-15 season.

“I’d like to thank Brad Stevens, Joe Mazzulla, and the entire Celtics organization for believing in me and giving me a chance to grow, lead, and develop,” said Pressey. “I’m grateful for the opportunity and I will give my all to this team. The community of Portland is amazing, and I remember my time as a player was unforgettable at the Expo. My goal is to instill winning habits into every player who suits up for the Maine Celtics.”

Pressey began his coaching career in 2022 as an assistant coach with his alma mater, the University of Missouri. He then joined the Boston Celtics in 2023 where he has been ever since, working as a Player Development coach. A three-year standout at Missouri, Pressey played in 148 career NBA games over three seasons, 125 of those with the Celtics from 2013-15. In that time, he averaged 3.1 points, 1.9 rebounds, and 2.9 assists per game. Additionally, he played in 78 career G League games from 2014-17.

“Phil is a dedicated coach who has been instrumental in our player development over the last two seasons,” said Boston Celtics Head Coach **Joe Mazzulla**. “I am looking forward to seeing him grow as a coach and leader. He shows great energy and a willingness to learn. His personality and communication will be a gift to his players.”

“We’re excited to welcome Phil to the Maine Celtics as our new head coach,” said Maine Celtics General Manager **Jarell Christian**. “Phil’s journey – from playing in the NBA and NBA G League to developing talent with the Boston Celtics – makes him the perfect fit to lead our team and connect with the Maine community. We can’t wait for our fans to get to know him and see the energy and passion he brings to the game.”

Pressey is the son of former NBA player **Paul Pressey**, who also was an assistant coach for seven NBA teams from 1992-2016.

MAINE CELTICS

Ron Harper Jr.

Guard – 6'5 – 233 pounds – Age: 25 – Two-Way Player – College: Rutgers

Ron Harper Jr. Signed a Two-Way Contract with the Boston Celtics on October 16, 2025. Harper Jr. appeared in three preseason games with the Celtics, averaging 4.3 points, 0.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists in 10.6 minutes per game. Harper Jr. shot 40.0% from the field, including 42.9% from three. The 25-year-old guard will embark on his fourth season in the NBA, most recently playing for the Detroit Pistons on a Two-Way Contract. He appeared in one game for the Pistons last season, recording four points, seven rebounds, and two assists in 17 minutes of work. Harper Jr. has appeared in 11 NBA games total during his career, averaging 2.2 points, 1.3 rebounds, and 0.6 assists. Prior to signing with the Pistons, Harper Jr. played 14 games with the Maine Celtics during the 2024-25 NBA G League season. He averaged 14.1 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 24.6 minutes per contest in a Maine uniform. When Harper Jr. inked a deal with Detroit, he became the 22nd NBA Call-Up in franchise history. Prior to his time in Detroit and Portland, the New Jersey native spent two seasons with the Toronto Raptors organization as a Two-Way player. Harper Jr. is the son of Ron Harper, a five-time NBA champion. His brother, Dylan Harper, was selected with the second overall pick in the 2025 NBA Draft by the San Antonio Spurs.

Max Shulga

Guard – 6'4 – 210 pounds – Age: 23 – Two-Way Player – College: VCU

Max Shulga was drafted by the Boston Celtics with the 57th overall pick in the 2025 NBA Draft. The rookie guard appeared in three preseason games with Boston, averaging 1.3 points, 1.0 rebounds and 0.7 assists in 3.1 minutes per game. Shulga played five Summer League contests for the Celtics, posting 5.0 points, 1.6 rebounds, and 3.8 assists in 21.0 minutes per game. Shulga also averaged 1.8 steals per game during Summer League. Shulga played his first three collegiate seasons at Utah State University, where he was teammates with current Boston Celtics center Neemias Queta. He played his final two collegiate seasons at Virginia Commonwealth, where Shulga was named the Atlantic 10 Conference Player of the Year after averaging 15.0 points, 5.9 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.8 steals per game during his senior campaign. Born in Kiev, Ukraine, Shulga is the eighth Ukrainian to be drafted to the NBA and is the third Celtic, joining Svi Mykhailiuk and Vitaly Potapenko.

Amari Williams

Center – 6'11 – 250 pounds – Age: 23 – Two-Way Player – College: Kentucky

Amari Williams was selected by the Boston Celtics with the 46th overall pick in the 2025 NBA Draft. The rookie appeared in three preseason games with Boston, averaging 2.0 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 0.7 assists in 5.3 minutes per game. Williams played in four Summer League contests, averaging 6.3 points, 5.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 17.6 minutes per game. Williams spent his first four collegiate seasons at Drexel University, where he became the first player in CAA history to win three conference Defensive Player of the Year Awards. Williams concluded his collegiate career at the University of Kentucky, where the forward averaged 10.9 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists on 56% shooting from the field. Defensively, he averaged 1.2 blocks per game for the Wildcats. Williams is the first British-born player in Celtics history.

Jalen Bridges

Forward – 6'8 – 225 pounds – Age: 24 – College: Baylor

How Acquired: Affiliate Player

Jalen Bridges begins his second season in the NBA G League and first with the Maine Celtics. Bridges played three preseason games with Boston, averaging 2.3 points, 1.3 rebounds and 0.7 assists in 7.5 minutes per game. He played four games with the Celtics in the 2025 NBA Summer League, tallying 8.0 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.5 steals in 15.5 minutes per game. After going undrafted in 2024, Bridges signed a Two-Way contract with the Phoenix Suns. Bridges appeared in eight regular season games with the Suns during his rookie season, averaging 1.1 points in 3.8 minutes per game. In the NBA G League, Bridges tallied 14.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.3 steals in 31 games with the Valley Suns. Bridges played two seasons at West Virginia before concluding his collegiate career with two more seasons at Baylor. Bridges was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection after posting career highs of 12.2 points, 5.7 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.1 steals per game during his senior season.

Kendall Brown

Guard – 6'8 – 205 pounds – Age: 22 – College: Baylor

How Acquired: Returning Player Rights

Kendall Brown begins his fourth professional season and first campaign with the Maine Celtics. Brown brings NBA experience to Maine, including his time spent with Boston during the 2025 preseason. Brown averaged 2.3 points, 1.0 rebounds and 0.7 assists in 5.1 minutes per game with the Celtics. During the 2025 NBA Summer League, Brown posted 8.6 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.0 assists in 15.0 minutes per game with Boston. Last season, Brown averaged 16.1 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.9 assists with the NBA G League's Long Island Nets. He agreed to a Two-Way deal with the Brooklyn Nets in February and finished the season splitting time between Long Island and Brooklyn. Drafted out of Baylor with the 48th overall pick in the 2022 NBA Draft by the Minnesota Timberwolves, Brown's rights were acquired by the Indiana Pacers. He spent two seasons with Indiana on a Two-Way contract, appearing in 21 total NBA games. In March 2024, Brown signed a standard NBA deal with Indiana. In his one collegiate season at Baylor, Brown was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman team after averaging 9.7 points and 4.9 rebounds per game.

Rahsool Diggins

Guard - 6'2 - 185 pounds - Age: 23 - College: Massachusetts

How Acquired: Player Pool

Rahsool Diggins begins his rookie season in Maine after a standout career with UMass. Diggins was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference Third Team after starting in all 32 games for the Minutemen during his senior campaign. Diggins averaged career-highs of 16.8 points, 2.8 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.2 steals per game. During his junior season at UMass, Diggins was named the Atlantic 10 Most Improved Player after increasing his scoring output from 4.7 PPG to 12.8 PPG. Prior to his three seasons with the Minutemen, Diggins played eight games during his freshman season at UConn in 2021-22.

Hayden Gray

Guard – 6'4 – 190 pounds – Age: 22 – College: UC San Diego

How Acquired: Affiliate Player

Hayden Gray joins the Maine Celtics for his rookie season. Gray competed in two games with the Boston Celtics during the 2025 NBA Summer League. Gray averaged 3.5 points, 1.0 rebounds, 1.0 assists, and 1.0 steals in 11.0 minutes per game. Gray's collegiate career began at Azusa Pacific for two seasons before he transferred to UC San Diego. In his final season with the Tritons, Gray averaged 11.2 points, 3.1 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 3.1 steals per game while shooting 41.8% from three. Gray was named the Big West Conference Defensive Player of the Year and led NCAA Division I in steals per game.

Makhi Mitchell

Center – 6'10 – 240 pounds – Age: 25 – College: Arkansas

How Acquired: Local Tryout Player

Makhi Mitchell will play in the NBA G League for the first time in his career in 2025. Mitchell arrived in Maine after recently playing professionally overseas. Mitchell played for Abejas de Leon (Mexico) and Dar City Basketball Team (Tanzania) in 2025, averaging 13.2 points, 6.9 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game in 16 total games between both teams. Mitchell played for Astros de Jalisco (Mexico) in 2024-25, averaging 11.7 points, 7.4 rebounds and 1.1 assists per game. Mitchell made stops at Maryland and Rhode Island before concluding his collegiate career with two seasons at Arkansas. In his senior campaign with the Razorbacks, Mitchell averaged 8.6 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.1 assists in 18.8 minutes per game.

Wendell Moore Jr.

Guard – 6'5 – 215 pounds – Age: 24 – College: Duke

How Acquired: Affiliate Player

Wendell Moore Jr. brings 90 games of NBA experience to Maine in his first season with the Celtics. He appeared in two preseason games with Boston, averaging 3.5 points and 1.5 assists in 8.7 minutes per game. Moore Jr. played in the 2025 NBA Summer League with the Orlando Magic, where the guard averaged 13.8 points, 6.8 rebounds and 1.0 steals in 22.7 minutes per game. Brown was selected 26th overall in the 2022 NBA Draft by the Dallas Mavericks. He holds career NBA averages of 2.3 points, 1.4 rebounds and 0.7 assists per game across three seasons with the Minnesota Timberwolves, Detroit Pistons and Charlotte Hornets. Moore Jr. most recently played 16 NBA games with Charlotte as a Two-Way player in 2024-25, averaging 5.4 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game. He has not appeared in an NBA G League game since the 2023-24 season. Moore Jr. played three collegiate seasons at Duke, where he helped the Blue Devils reach the Final Four in 2022. At the conclusion of his junior season, Moore Jr. earned Second Team All-ACC honors, was named to the ACC All-Defensive Team, and won the Julius Irving Award, which is given to the nation's top small forward.

Aaron Scott

Guard - 6'7 - 200 pounds – Age: 22 – College: St. John's

How Acquired: Affiliate Player

Aaron Scott joins the Maine Celtics for his rookie season. Scott competed with the Boston Celtics during training camp and the 2025 NBA Summer League. Scott played in two Summer League contests with the Celtics, averaging 1.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 11.8 minutes per game. Scott played a key role in St. John's winning their first outright Big East title since 1985. In his final collegiate season, he averaged 8.4 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.4 steals in 36 games with the Red Storm. Scott played his first three collegiate seasons at North Texas, where he helped the Mean Green win the NIT Championship in 2023.

Stefan Todorovic

Forward - 6'8 - 190 pounds - Age: 23 - College: Pepperdine

How Acquired: 2025 NBA G League Draft

Stefan Todorovic was acquired in a draft day trade with the Motor City Cruise, who selected Todorovic with the 9th overall pick. Todorovic played four games during the 2025 NBA Summer League with the Philadelphia 76ers. He averaged 3.5 points and 1.5 rebounds in 7.6 minutes per game. A rookie from Belgrade, Serbia, Todorovic started all 35 games during his senior season at Pepperdine. Todorovic led the Waves in scoring in 2024-25, averaging 18.3 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game on 43% shooting from the floor. He was third on the team in rebounds. Prior to his one season at Pepperdine, Todorovic played one season at San Francisco, averaging 3.8 points and 1.5 rebounds per game as a junior. Todorovic also played two collegiate seasons at Southern Methodist.

Hason Ward

Forward – 6'9 – 230 pounds – Age: 25 – College: Iowa State

How Acquired: Returning Player Rights

Hason Ward returns to Maine for his second season with the Celtics. He competed in 2025 NBA Summer League with Oklahoma City, averaging 5.3 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game on 65% shooting from the field. During his rookie season in 2024-25, Ward was the only Maine Celtics player to appear in all 50 games. Ward averaged 7.8 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.2 assists on 66% shooting from the floor in 21.9 minutes per game. Defensively, Ward recorded 2.2 blocks per contest, which ranked inside the top 10 among G League rim defenders. He played three collegiate seasons at Virginia Commonwealth and was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Defensive team in 2021. Ward played his final two collegiate seasons at Iowa State. He averaged 6.0 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game in his final season, leading the Cyclones to an NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2024. Ward was born in St. Thomas, Barbados and was a high school basketball standout at Springfield Central in Springfield, Massachusetts.

Kameron Warrens

Guard – 6'5 – 205 pounds – Age: 25 – College: University of Mary

How Acquired: Returning Player Rights

Kameron Warrens is back in green after appearing in 22 total games for the Maine Celtics during his rookie season in 2024-25. Warrens averaged 4.2 points and 2.1 rebounds in 14.3 minutes per game last season. The second-year guard lit up the Portland Expo on February 13, 2025, when Warrens scored 17 of his career-high 19 points in the third quarter to lead Maine to a thrilling victory over Long Island. Warrens has previously played professionally in the Georgia-A League, appearing in 14 games for VSA in Georgia. Warrens was a three-year standout at the University of Mary in North Dakota. He started all 26 games his senior season, averaging 12.8 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game. Warrens began his collegiate career at Yuba College for two seasons.
